Hebrew Scripture Lesson: 1 Samuel 3:1-20

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

²At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; ³the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was.

⁴Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" ⁵and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me."

But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down.

⁶The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again."

⁷Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. ⁸The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy.

⁹Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

¹⁰Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

¹¹Then the Lord said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle.

¹²On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end.

¹³For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them.

¹⁴Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever."

¹⁵Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the Lord. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli.

¹⁶But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." He said, "Here I am."

¹⁷Eli said, "What was it that he told you? Do not hide it from me. May God do so to you and more also, if you hide anything from me of all that he told you."

¹⁸So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. Then he said, "It is the Lord; let him do what seems good to him."

¹⁹As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground.

²⁰And all Israel from Dan to Beer-sheba knew that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the Lord.

Sermon-There Is Life Beyond Delivery

Let us pray.

Gracious Lord, with all of the things going on in the world today we may wonder what our Christian discipleship is to look like. Some of us are discouraged with the spikes in the number of cases of the corona virus, the isolation, the risks, the fear based news, and it goes on and on. We need to hear from you how do we live as your people, and we need to hear your words of promise of hope. We ask that you use me as your instrument to proclaim your hope this day. Amen.

I read the scripture lessons for today, not once but many times. They spoke to me in a multitude of ways. Psalm 139 is such an intimate portrayal of God's connection with us. The many times that we wonder where God is—is answered. Psalms are the oldest texts in the Bible and describe every human emotion. At a time where many of us are feeling very isolated, we read this psalm and hear these words: "O Lord you have searched me and know me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away." Our God is with us in all things, even the menial motions of life. God is here! The psalmist goes on to describe the ways that God goes before us on our path. God knows what we are going to say before the words touch our lips. It is no wonder that the psalmist states that God's knowledge is too wonderful to understand.

Years ago there was a movie called, "The Mirror has Two Faces". Barbara Streisand and Jeff Bridges play the lead roles. Barbara Streisand's character makes a statement of what she wants most in life, and that is to have someone "really know" her. God is that most important "Someone!"

Psalm 139 continues on to help us understand that we were carefully made as God would have to be. Verse 13-14 says, "For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; for I know very well." Scripture does not say anything about us having bodies like a model, professional wrestler, body builder, yoga instructor, pro ball player, Barbie, or a Ken doll. When we put ourselves down we are putting down the work of the Lord. I am guilty of this one, too. We were made carefully, and wonderfully, scripture says. Some of you that are older maybe saying, "That might have been true, but now maybe not so much." Even aging is part of the way we were made, and does not take away from God's calling of us. We were made to be loved, and to love serving the Lord in this life at any and all ages of our life.

The text from 1 Samuel, chapter 3, is a story of betrayal, discernment, and calling. Samuel is a child in this story. Samuel's mother was <u>Hannah</u> and his father was <u>Elkanah</u>. According to 1 Samuel 1:1-28, Elkanah had two wives, Peninnah and Hannah. Peninnah had children; Hannah did not. She was considered a barren woman. Nonetheless, Elkanah favored Hannah. Jealous, Penninah treated Hannah as if she were less than, and as if she didn't try to bare children, causing Hannah much heartache. On one occasion, Hannah went to the sanctuary and prayed for a child. In tears, she vowed that if she were granted a child, she would dedicate him to God as a <u>Nazirite</u>.

<u>Eli</u>, who was sitting at the foot of the doorpost in the sanctuary at Shiloh, saw her mumbling to herself and thought she was drunk, but he was soon assured of her motivation and sobriety. This is to say that Samuel was a miracle. The miracle, Samuel, was indeed dedicated to service of God.

Samuel worked for Eli in the temple. Eli was the priest of Shiloh, and one of the last Israelite Judges before the rule of kings in ancient Israel. He had assumed the leadership after Samson's death. Eli was over the Ark of the Covenant. The Ark of the Covenant is a gold-covered wooden chest with lid cover, described in the Book of Exodus as containing the two stone tablets of the Ten Commandments. Eli blessed Hannah in the story, and she returned home. Not long afterward, Hannah became pregnant, and gave birth to Samuel. After Samuel was weaned, Hannah left him in Eli's care, and from time to time she would come to visit her son.

The story begins with Samuel and Eli in the temple in Shiloh. Eli was tutoring Samuel. One night while Samuel was sleeping, he heard a voice calling him and assumed that it was Eli. Three times he heard the calling of his name believing that it was Eli. The text states that the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to Samuel. Even though he worked in the temple, he did not know the Lord personally. So, he did not recognized the voice of the Lord. Eli, told the boy to go back to bed, and if the Lord spoke to him again, he was to say, "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening." Samuel went to bed, and when the Lord called him again, he did as he was told and said, "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening." The Lord gave Samuel instructions as well as indication of what was to come.

The Lord blessed the mother of this child, Samuel, to be loved, and to love serving the Lord. Even though Samuel was just a child, he was given a calling. The Lord does not make any of us to be "just a" anything. We are carefully, and wonderfully made for God has willed it!

Is there Life after Delivery??

In a mother's womb were two babies. One asked the other: "Do you believe in life after delivery?"

The other replies, "Why, of course. There has to be something after delivery. Maybe we are here to prepare ourselves for what we will be later...."

"Nonsense," says the other. "There is no life after delivery. What would that life be?"

"I don't know, but there will be more light than here. Maybe we will walk with our legs and eat from our mouths."

The other says "This is absurd! Walking is impossible. And eat with our mouths? Ridiculous. The umbilical cord supplies nutrition. Life after delivery is to be excluded. The umbilical cord is too short."

"I think there is something and maybe it's different than it is here." The other replies,

"No one has ever come back from there. Delivery is the end of life, and in the after-delivery, it is nothing but darkness and anxiety and it takes us nowhere."

"Well, I don't know," says the other, "but certainly we will see mother and she will take care of us."

"Mother??" You believe in mother? Where is she now?"

"She is all around us. It is in her that we live. Without her there would not be this world."

"I don't see her, so it's only logical that she doesn't exist."

To which the other replied, "Sometimes when you're in silence you can hear her, you can perceive her. I believe there is a reality after delivery and we are here to prepare ourselves for that reality...."

This article made me think about how some of us have an inward hope, that maybe we were born with, or learned at an early age. Where some of us are more like the other baby, and need more proof of the new life, that we have through our Lord Jesus. No matter where we are in our belief, we are loved by God, and known fully said the Psalmist.

1 Samuel teaches us that we are called no matter how old or young we are, and as we spend time in the word of God, the word will come upon us, and we will hear God's voice, and know that we are called. There is life beyond delivery into this new life in Christ, and we are all wonderfully made just as we are to live into by God's grace that goes before us, and all around us.

There is always hope in the One who gave His life for our new life. Our challenge this week is to spend time in the silence as Samuel did to hear God's voice speaking to us words of love, and calling. Amen.
